Hello R5 Community,

Happy New Year from all of us here at R5 High School! The first semester at R5 this school year was an incredible success. We had nearly 10 learners graduate from R5 already in this school year which is exciting. Our learners continue to grow each day through the amazing projects they have the opportunity to be involved in. Teachers are challenging them with real-world skills to think creatively and critically on a daily basis and to develop social, personal, and emotional skills that will help them be successful beyond R5. We are looking forward to the start of the second semester and continuing to offer challenging learning experiences for everyone.

As we kick off the third quarter at R5 High School, I want to provide a reminder and emphasis about the importance of attendance. Research shows that less than 90% attendance can lead to learning loss, confusion, and possible challenges with graduation. There are 45 days in a quarter at R5 High School and missing just 5 days results in an attendance rate below 90%. Additionally, missing 10 days is below 80%. This means that learners who miss at least one day each week are chronically absent and face additional challenges with school success.

We care deeply about each learner at R5 and our program is designed to support those who have struggled with school and/or attendance in the past. One of the quickest ways for learners to be successful at R5 is simply to be present every day. We ask for your partnership and support with encouraging your learners to be at R5 every day. If for some reason, a learner needs to be out, please call us and let us know. Alternatively, you will receive a call for each day your learner is absent from one or more classes. Communication is key in helping learners succeed and we can't do it without you. Please call us if you have any questions or concerns at any time. Thank you for being a part of our growing community.

Here are some critical dates for graduation – so mark your calendars!

- **FEBRUARY 23RD DEADLINE** – Parents and/or students are responsible for purchasing learner caps and gowns. You can order your basic package (approximately \$50.00) from Jostens at www.jostens.com or you can call 970-242-5030.
 - Jostens needs your height and weight ahead of your order so they can ensure they have your correct size on hand. Watch for the Height and Weight QR code (on the announcements, in the Phoenix Gazette, and at the front office) and please enter your information as soon as you can. Entering your height and weight in the QR code **DOES NOT ORDER YOUR CAP AND GOWN**.
 - **FEBRUARY 7TH @ 9:45 AM** – SENIOR CLASS MEETING – Meet in the Harry Butler Boardroom (at R5) at 9:45 a.m. We will provide you with important details about graduation; nominating/voting on a class song, flower, and motto. A representative from Josten's will be available for questions regarding caps, gowns, rings, and special orders. **Your parents and/or guardians are welcome to attend this meeting.**
 - **MAY 3RD – DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING YOUR GRADUATION SPEECH.** If you would like to make a speech at graduation, please prepare a 3-5 minute speech, type it out, and email your submission to Mrs. Nesbit @ denae.nesbit@ds1schools.org or Ms. Casey @ sutton.casey@ds1schools.org by this date.
 - **MAY 3RD – LAST DAY TO TAKE WORKKEYS TEST. THIS IS REQUIRED FOR GRADUATION.**
 - **MAY 8TH** – All assignments that are due for credit, must be turned in to your teachers by 3:00 p.m.
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- **WEEK BEFORE GRADUATION** – Pick up your cap and gown from the front office at R5. **TAKE IT OUT OF THE PACKAGE AND HANG IT UP!** To remove creases: put it in the dryer (on a low setting) for a short time with a wet washcloth.
